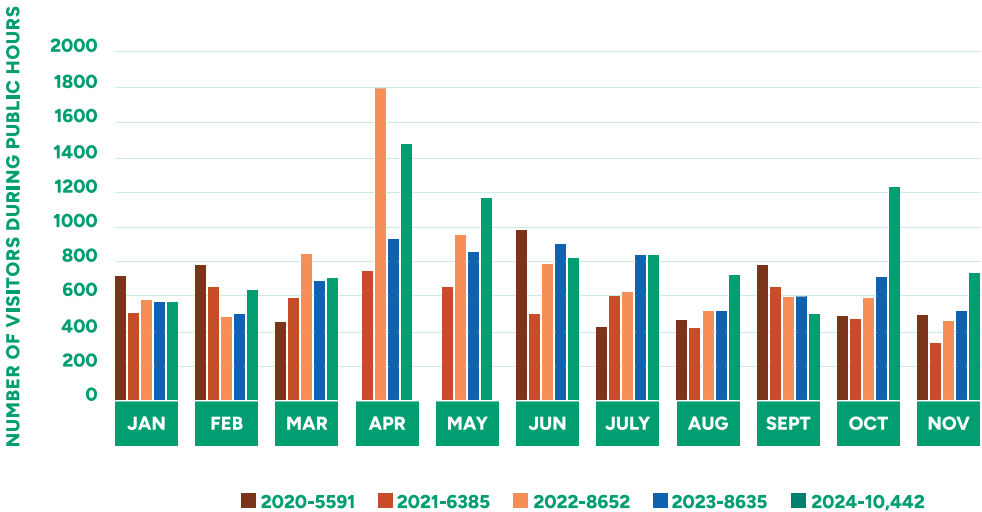

EXPERIENCE THE RANCHO FOR YOURSELF

In 2024, 17,678 individuals visited during public hours, programs, site use and special events combined. Of these, 10,442, 21% more than the previous year, visited during public hours, which represents a record high! The chart below illustrates the monthly attendance trends over the past five years.

During the past year, 31% of visitors opted for docent-led tours of the house or gardens and 14% toured both. RLC’s 32 amazing docents were on hand to lead a total of 1,082 tours, hosting 3,140 guests.

PRESERVATION

ADOBE WALL REPAIR

In 2024 much needed attention was focused on repairing interior and exterior cracks in the adobe walls. For this project we used adobe restoration expert, Gil Sanchez. As a leader in this specialized field, Gil created a formula to fill the deteriorating portions of the walls.

Thanks to the generosity of the Long Beach Navy Memorial Heritage Association, the adobe walls stand strong and proud as they await new paint in 2025.

NEW PERIOD ROOMS

Generously funded by Barbara Blackwell and Margie & Frank Newell, Rancho Los Cerritos opened two new period rooms in the historic adobe, offering a more comprehensive look into the site's expansive history.

The first room is the newly restored and furnished 1930s Living Room. Representative of the 1930s when Llewellyn and Avis Bixby had the house remodeled, it features historic Monterey style furniture of the era and recalls the period's shift away from formality to comfort and utility. The room's artifacts, like jigsaw puzzles, Mahjong, and magazines, reflect inexpensive forms of leisure and activities that became popular as the nation grappled with the Great Depression

Configured as an exhibit space, the second of the two rooms represents the Rancho's Tenant Period from 1881-1927 when the house was gradually transformed into apartments. Many tenants were first generation Mexican Americans and Mexican migrants, reflecting growing immigrant populations in Long Beach. Aiming to bring their narratives forward, using artifacts, installations, historic photographs, and oral histories, the room's content speaks to the nuances of everyday life as working-class, immigrant families.

VERANDA RESTORATION PROJECT

Completed in 2024, the veranda is restored to its former glory thanks to generous funding from Steve & Nancy Dudley, Long Beach Navy Memorial Heritage Association, and the New L. Family Fund.



INNOVATION

LOOKING BACK TO ADVANCE FORWARD (LBTAFF) – COMPLETE!

The excitement began in 2018 upon receiving the ambitiously innovative project's first grant from the Port of Long Beach. Followed by generous funding from both RMC (San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy) and MWD (Metropolitan Water District), a groundbreaking ceremony took place in February of 2022 with construction of the first of three phases beginning later that same year.

By the time you are reading this, all three phases will be finished. Partnering with the Conservation Corps of Long Beach, Phase III, which began in 2024, adds to an already robust system of water capture techniques and increases the volume of water that can be stored in the site's 22,000-gallon cistern. Incorporating the lower parking lot, which is shared with Virginia Country Club, installation of a drain, the construction of a green strip, and the creation of a bioswale along Virginia Road, allow water to naturally infiltrate back into the ground. Besides storing water to use for drip irrigation, RLC's goal is to recharge the groundwater table beneath and eliminate pollutants from reaching the L.A. River, and ultimately the Pacific Ocean. Another important aspect of this final phase was to incorporate an ADA-compliant pathway to the observation deck, near educational signage that teaches about water's impacts on Rancho Los Cerritos over the past 180 years.

Be on the lookout for exciting complementary STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts & mathematics) components as part of RLC's educational initiative.



ADOBE AUDIO AND AROMAS

RLC launched its Adobe Audio and Aromas project which incorporates sounds, using small Bluetooth speakers, and scents, using scented reed diffusers, strategically hidden from sight across the historic home. In the 1860s Laundry Room, for instance, visitors walk into the sound of clothes being washed by hand and water being poured into a wooden tub while smells of soap and freshly cleaned linen fill the air. The Blacksmith Shop now features auditory elements related to forging such as clanging hammers, cooling metal, and tool sharpening on a grindstone. Providing more accessible pathways to interpretation and driven by the Rancho's commitment to accessibility for all, implementing sensory elements allows all visitors, including those with visual or auditory limitations, to experience the site in a more meaningful way.

FIRE SUPPRESSION

Thanks in large part to generous funding from Nancy & Stephen Dudley, Rancho Los Cerritos was able to begin the process of installing a fire suppression system by hiring consultant, Nick Artim, whose resume includes system installations at Monticello, Montpelier, and countless other sites of significant historical importance. Beginning with detection/notification systems in place in early 2025, installation of a low-pressure mist system in the Adobe is scheduled to follow.



EDUCATION

ADELANTE: THE PEOPLE OF RANCHO LOS CERRITOS

In 2024, Rancho Los Cerritos fully launched *Adelante: The People of Rancho Los Cerritos*, a free educational program for fourth-grade classes in the Long Beach Unified School District and neighboring districts. This program offers a place-based learning experience to enrich students' understanding of the rancho era in California history, aligning with History/Social Science (HSS) and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS).

In its first official year, *Adelante* served 3,974 students and aims to reach 5,300 in the 2024/25 school year, including approximately 2,000 from 22 Title I schools, with a goal of 5,500 by 2025–2026. Teachers overwhelmingly support the program, with 100% agreeing it aligns with content standards and serves as a valuable supplement to classroom instruction.

For many students, this field trip is their first visit to a museum or historic site. To ensure equitable access, RLC waives classroom fees and covers transportation costs for Title I schools, removing a major barrier for underserved students. With bus prices averaging \$750 per trip and new regulations limiting student capacity, many schools struggle to afford field trips. By funding transportation, RLC enables more students to experience this enriching program.

We are grateful for funding from the Earl B. and Loraine H. Miller Foundation, the Rudolph J. and Daphne A. Munzer Foundation, the Evalyn M. Bauer Foundation, an Anonymous Foundation, the New L Family Fund, and the LGA Family Foundation, for making *Adelante* possible.

ENVIRONMENTAL CURRICULUM

In 2024, with generous support from the Rudolph J. and Daphne A. Munzer Foundation and the San Gabriel and Lower Los Angeles Rivers and Mountains Conservancy, RLC began developing a STEAM-based (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics) curriculum for 11th-grade students. This program will complement the *Looking Back to Advance Forward* water recapture and reuse project while exploring environmental justice, water sustainability, and climate change.

Set to launch in 2025, an advisory group comprised of community members, educators, and high school students developed a five-part curriculum that addresses the journey of water through time and space. It includes four asynchronous in-class workshops for teachers to facilitate, along with STEAM Days at RLC every other month during the school year.

PROGRAMMING

RLC connects the community to local history through a wide array of low to no-cost programs designed to engage and benefit people from all walks of life. Whether exploring the historic grounds or participating in hands-on activities, there is something enriching for everyone.



TOURS OF THE HISTORIC HOME & GARDENS

Guests are welcome to tour the historic grounds virtually or in-person through docent-led or self-guided tours.



MONTHLY BIRD WALK

Each second Thursday, RLC's Horticulturist leads a guided walk to learn about birds and explore their natural habitat.



STORYTIME & STORYTIME BILINGUE

These programs promote literacy, ignite imagination, empower young minds, and foster language development.



CITY NATURE CHALLENGE

This event invites the public to observe and document various birds, bugs, and critters in our local ecosystem.



RANCHOS WALK

An annual one-of-a-kind 9.4-mile journey between two Long Beach landmarks: Rancho Los Cerritos and Rancho Los Alamitos.

EXHIBITIONS

VISITOR CENTER EXHIBITION

Untold Legacies: Rethinking the American Cowboy opened in the summer of 2024, welcoming nearly 200 visitors on opening day. Through historic photographs, interactive installations, and contemporary artwork, the exhibition explored the often-overlooked contributions of Mexican, Indigenous, and African American cowboys, challenging stereotypes and highlighting key aspects of cowboy culture.

Led by Guest Curator Martin Etem, the exhibition was developed in collaboration with the Rancho's Exhibit Committee, participating artists, and with the support of the Port of Long Beach. *Untold Legacies* provides a powerful exploration of California's ranching history, amplifying diverse narratives that continue to redefine the cowboy's legacy in the American West.

Stay tuned for our upcoming exhibition, *WaterWays*, opening August 2025.

LIBRARY EXHIBITION

In conjunction with *Untold Legacies*, Rancho Los Cerritos opened a library exhibit titled, *Freedom West: Resistance and Triumph in California*. This exhibit examines how the Fugitive Slave Act and California's statehood contributed to the rise of abolition and civil rights in the West. The exhibit highlighted the lives of three African American abolitionists, Biddy Mason, Mary Ellen Pleasant, and Mifflin Wistar Gibbs, who fought for freedom and equality in the newly established state.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Rancho Los Cerritos continues its collaborative efforts by working to strengthen and create partnerships with other nonprofits, businesses, civic representatives, and the greater Long Beach Community. A premiere Southern California venue, RLC is happy to host important events on its historic site.

GARDENS

A source of beauty, serenity and history, Rancho Los Cerritos Gardens continue to enchant visitors both new and returning. With endless paths to explore, guests of all ages are sure to delight in the sights, scents, and sounds of their Rancho Garden adventures. Woven throughout the 4.7-acre landscape, some gardens were designed in the early 1930s by notable landscape architect, Ralph Cornell, who has been called the single most influential landscape architect to shape Los Angeles.

Don't miss the Museum Shop if you would like to take a bit of the Rancho home with you! Among the many unique offerings, some site grown fruits, herbs, and seeds are harvested year-round for products whose proceeds benefit RLC.

CITY NATURE CHALLENGE

From April 26-29, 197 individuals including school groups and brownie troops, participated in 2024's City Nature Challenge (CNC). Environmental science interns guided visitors on this community science adventure as they located and documented wildlife. Observations are then confirmed, and data is made available worldwide to scientists studying biodiversity, population shifts and multiple facets.

THE ALAN L. FOX MEMORIAL GARDEN

Alan L. Fox, a long-time, incredibly dedicated board member and trained Garden Docent, passed away on April 4th. Especially passionate about the gardens, Alan always envisioned a revitalized area

in front of the inner courtyard's green gates. Thanks to donations received in his honor, where that barren space once was, now lives a budding Cornell inspired garden in his memory.

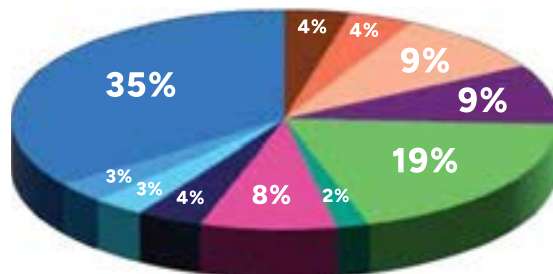


VOLUNTEERS AND INTERNS

Volunteers play a crucial role at Rancho Los Cerritos. Their dedication assists in preservation, enhances visitor experiences, and fosters a sense of community engagement, ensuring the continued vitality and relevance of the historic site. In 2024, 200 volunteers, 38 of which were brand new, contributed a total of 11,800 hours. An 8% increase from 10,922 hours logged in 2023! Volunteers regularly facilitate public hours, assist in special events, engage in gardening and curatorial work, conduct outreach and education programs, serve on the foundation's Board of Directors, and so much more! Our volunteers are truly the lifeblood of the Rancho. Their support is valued at approximately \$413,000, and we are incredibly grateful for their contributions!

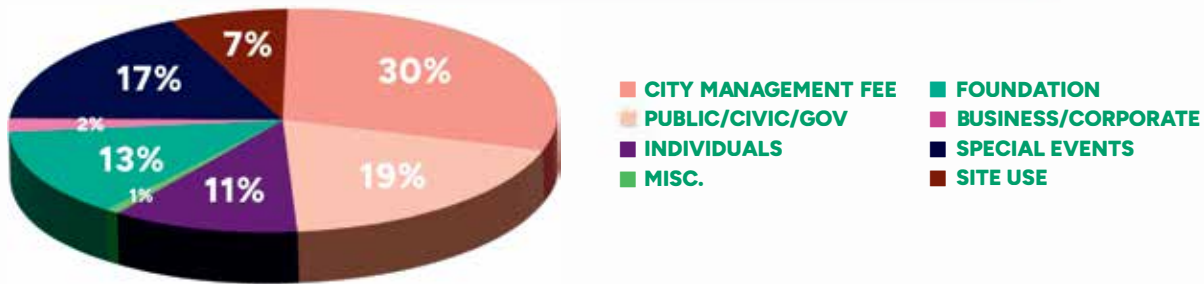

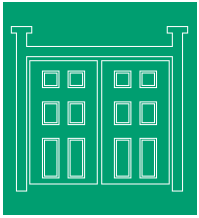
